Ivan Avoscan museographic walk

In Buxy, in the heart of Burgundy's wine country, a unique artistic adventure is taking root. Maison Millebuis unveils an unprecedented sculptural trail in tribute to Ivan Avoscan, a renowned 20th-century Burgundian sculptor. This open-air walk connects monumental art with local heritage, weaving a subtle link between the minerality of the wines and that of the stone.

A work rooted in Burgundy's soil

Ivan Avoscan (1928–2012), a discreet yet major sculptor of the 20th century, chose the stone of Buxy as his material of predilection. His sculptures—spheres, doors, staircases, totems—are all hand-carved in direct carving, reflecting a total commitment to the material. Inspired by Antoine Bourdelle, Constantin Brancusi, and Germaine Richier, he sculpted silence, light, and the intimate dialogue with nature.

“Like pruning the vine, carving stone is an irreversible commitment.”

Two major creative cycles mark his career:

1. **Spontaneous, organic sculptures**, imbued with mystery
2. **Architectural and symbolic sculptures**, guided by order, light, and geometry.

His works evoke metamorphosis, stability, and movement. They speak to us of stone, breath, and the sacred.

Today, his creations can be admired in Montélimar, Lyon, Grenoble, Chalon, Seoul, Copenhagen, Tokyo, Kawasaki...

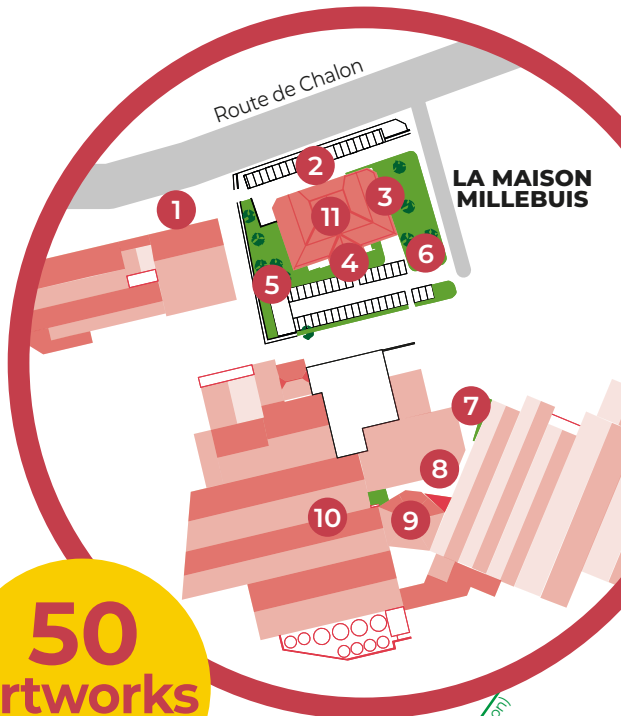
The itinerary invites you to a free self-guided walk through:

- **Maison Millebuis:** tasting cellar, courtyard, terrace, winery (information available at reception)
- **The former cellar and the old winery's quay**
- **Various sites around the village:** town hall, church, tourist office, Brasserie Le Pinnacle, and Place de la Poste.

At Maison Millebuis, the different areas to visit:

- 1 **Monumental** (old winery quay)
- 2 **In Balance I** (seminary façade)
- 3 **Symbolic**
(display cases: Figurative–Abstract / Doors / Sun / Source)
- 4 **In Balance II** (tasting cellar balcony)
- 5 **Organic** (left lawn)
- 6 **Geometric** (right lawn)
- 7 **Vegetal** (pathway to the winery)
- 8 **Architectural** (patio)
- 9 **Of Air & Water** (former cellar)
- 10 **Enigmatic** (barrel cellar)
- 11 **A Life in 5 Works**
